



Sea Thrift
Armeria maritima

Description:

Tall stems with small, pink or lavender globed flowers rise above low mounded tufts of blue-green grass-like foliage; heat and drought tolerant, an excellent addition to borders, beds, containers and fresh-cut arrangements

Ornamental Features

Sea Thrift has masses of beautiful balls of pink flowers with lavender overtones at the ends of the stems from mid spring to early summer, which are most effective when planted in groupings. Its tiny grassy leaves remain bluish-green in colour throughout the year.

Landscape Attributes

Sea Thrift is a dense herbaceous evergreen perennial with a mounded form. It brings an extremely fine and delicate texture to the garden composition and should be used to full effect.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and should be cut back in late fall in preparation for winter. Deer don't particularly care for this plant and will usually leave it alone in favor of tastier treats. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Sea Thrift is recommended for the following landscape applications;

Planting & Growing

Sea Thrift will grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity extending to 12 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 10 inches. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an evergreen perennial, this plant will typically keep its form and foliage year-round.

This plant does best in full sun to partial shade. It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil, and will often die in standing water. It is considered to be drought-tolerant, and thus makes an ideal choice for a low-water garden or xeriscape application. This plant does not require much in the way of fertilizing once established. It is not particular as to soil type or pH, and is able to handle environmental salt. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This species is native to parts of North America. It can be propagated by division.

Sea Thrift is a fine choice for the garden, but it is also a good selection for planting in outdoor pots and containers. It is often used as a 'filler' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination, providing a mass of flowers against which the thriller plants stand out. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
